URGENT NOTICE: EPA and Building Departments can fine Contractors for not complying with the new “RRP” law as of April 22, 2010. Get trained and certified.

On April 22, 2010, enforcement of the EPA’s new lead-in-paint law called the Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule goes into effect. If you are doing any kind of work that involves cutting into lead-based paint (e.g. replacing windows or doors, cabinets, woodwork, trim... any painted surface that might contain lead-based paint), you will be held accountable for being EPA certified in advance of starting the job and in compliance on your job sites.

In the EPA’s words, this rule applies to all “renovations” performed for “compensation” in pre-1978 “target housing” and in “child-occupied facilities.” The Rule’s requirements are triggered when paint which has not been certified as lead-free, is disturbed by any renovation, repair or painting project in interior or exterior work. Firms performing these renovations must submit an application to become EPA certified, and individuals who work for Certified Renovation Firms must be properly trained and EPA certified as “Renovators” or be trained and supervised on the job by Certified Renovators.
